



ECPAT-USA'S CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM SEXUAL EXPLOITATION IN TRAVEL AND TOURISM

Effective May 23, 2019

MGM Resorts is a member of ECPAT-USA's Code of Conduct for the Protection of Children from Sexual Exploitation in Travel and Tourism.

After years of independent anti-human trafficking activity MGM Resorts signed ECPAT's Tourism Child-Protection Code of Conduct ([The Code](#)), a worldwide network of organizations working to end the sexual exploitation of children. ECPAT supports shelters for survivors and law enforcement training, conducts a wide range of research of human trafficking to inform policy making and advocates for change with governments, business and other societal institutions.

MGM Resorts has implemented several measures against human trafficking, including establishing relevant policies, procedures and practices, as well as educating and training employees. Joining ECPAT gives renewed focus to these commitments and provides the Company with an additional platform to reinforce its internal efforts with enhanced collaboration and engagement with external partners and resources.

Prominent among MGM's standing anti-human trafficking commitment is its active participation in the Southern Nevada Human Trafficking Task Force – an external partnership that convenes government officials, law enforcement, business representatives and community members to address human trafficking.
